1. Call to Order: Ginger Pohlman called the regular meeting to order at 7:35 PM.
2. Approval of the minutes: Gary Sheridan made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of January 4, 2018 as amended. Ginger Pohlman seconded and the vote was unanimous.
3. Discussions:
 - Discussed potential recycling program for video cassettes, DVDs, etc. There is not thought to be a great demand for recycling these types of items, since they are still useful. Therefore, East Whiteland Township recommends donating such items to a worthy organization.
 - Updates on cleanup of the Bishop Tube site: reviewed PA DEP's January 8, 2018 notice of violation letter to CDP and CDP's response. The purpose of the correspondence is to develop a work plan to mitigate the release into Little Valley Creek of contaminated site groundwater and/or flowable fill from a leaking pipe.
 - Reviewed status of the Technical Evaluation Grant application for the Bishop Tube site. The grant application was submitted by East Whiteland Township on October 16, 2017. DEP responded on December 11, 2017, with a list of additional details needed to support the application. EAC will offer to meet with Steve Brown, as needed, in order to help outline consultant qualifications desired, tasks to be performed by consultant, estimate of costs and task completion schedule.
 - Gary Sheridan announced that residents should be aware that the Adelphia Pipeline, which runs through East Whiteland, will be undergoing a use change from oil to natural gas.

5. Old Business: There were no old business items.
6. New Business: There were no new business items.
7. Meeting Adjournment: The meeting adjourned at 9:15 PM.
